CMRA Meeting Minutes

The July 2010 CMRA meeting and annual auction were held July 13th at 7 PM in a conference room at Columbia Regional Hospital.

The brief meeting was called to order at 7:05 by Daniel, KCOUTW, who opened with words of welcome and a thank you to auctioneer Brent Voorheis for being there to conduct the auction.

Due to power supply problems at Field Day, Daniel asked Don, KM0R, to discuss a proposed solution. Roofing work at Paquin Tower made work necessary during June on the 146.76 repeater. Don discovered a need for a better power supply for the repeater. He proposed a new power supply be purchased for the repeater and the repeater's former power supply be used by the club for emergencies or Field Day. The cost of the new power supply would be a little under \$500. Don thought it could be ordered and installed within two weeks. After some discussion, this proposal was voted on and approved. The possibility of getting a battery backup was tabled for later consideration.

Pam, KD0GRQ, said antenna tuners weren't working at

Field Day. She recommended they be checked out at the club station to decide on repairs or replacement. The idea was tabled for follow up at the next meeting.

Minutes from the previous meeting were approved.

Dewey, WM0H, reminded everyone of testing at the club station the following Monday.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:18 PM, and the auction followed immediately.
