Tuesday, August 18, the Federal **Communications Commission** jumped on the technological bandwagon and began "Twittering."...To date, the FCC's Twitter page has almost 1900 followers. The FCC has also started a blog called Blogband http://blog.broadband.gov/. According to Chairman Julius Genachowski (who made the first post), "Blogband is part of the FCC's commitment to an open and participatory process...We want it to be a two-way conversation." Readers may leave comments after each post, but comments will be monitored during normal business hours and will be reviewed as "speedily as possible" before posting...So visit Blogband often to keep up with the latest news and -- more importantly – get involved." The FCC pointed out that commenting in the blog "is not a substitute for submitting a formal comment in the record of a specific Commission proceeding."
