CMRA Meeting Minutes

Boone Electric Cooperative Conference Room August 10, 2010 President Daniel Johnson KCØUTW called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm with 24 members and visitors present. Members introduced themselves by name and call sign.

The minutes of the July 13 meeting were approved as distributed on the web site.

Treasurer Don KMØR gave the treasurer's report.

Checking \$1,486.16 Savings \$2,253.74 CD \$2,252.96

Don KMØR reported that the auction last month netted \$640.50. Pam reported that approximately 200 contacts were made at Field Day. Several members stayed all night and one was on the radio most of the night. CW-ers are needed for next year. There was a small group for the superb dinner. Dave KVØS will send the report to the ARRL.

Dewey WMØH reported that a Net manager is needed. Also an an Examination Liaison is needed. A battery backup is needed for the repeater.

Jake KDØIRU and Corey KCØYNS reported on the amateur

radio activities at the Great Rivers Council Power of Scouting 100th year celebration at Fayette. About 1,500 scouts participated in the event. There was a good response from Scouts. HF and 2 meter radios were available. Several CMRA members participated at the event as well as on the air. ~ 50 contacts were made. Pres Daniel commended the CMRA members for their participation and time spent in supporting this event. Don KMØR commented on the need for pauses during repeater use to permit another operator the opportunity to use the repeater. If an emergency would arise a contact might be difficult to be made.

Fox Hunting: moved to Jefferson City. Last event had 3 cars (one of which had 3 hams in it). This week's fox hunt will be centered at Ashland and have a 10 mile radius. Saturday, August 14 at 9:30 am. Don NØUBC reported that he will travel to Boonville to discuss fox hunting.
